

Stitches and Giggles will meet on January 15 at 10am. Verna Kelly will be here to help us make pillow cases. You will need to bring thread, straight pins, yard stick, scissors and a sewing machine if available.

For a Standard size pillow case you will need: 3/4 yard of material for the body of the case, 1/4 yard of material for the cuff of the case and 2 inches of material for the accent band.

For a Queen size pillow you will need: 31 inches of material for the body of the case, $\frac{1}{2}$ yard of material for the cuff of the case and 2 inches of material for the accent band.

For a King size pillow you will need: 1 yard of material for the body of the case, 1/4 yard of material for the cuff of the case and 2 inches of material for the accent band.

This is for one pillowcase. Hope to see everyone there!!

YOUTH NEWS



December 2013 Quarterly Report-update of Health Status-Also Christmas Greeting-

It has been some time since we have communicated with you: We were waiting for some concrete information.—This regarded the selling of our house and property—update on our health problems and also to send you Christmas Greetings. It is evident that the house has not been sold—We have been since last July when six individuals one by one sought to buy—but for varied reasons did not (unable to obtain loan—more property that could handle, etc. Three other people later also looked—and again did not buy)—After the holidays we will list it with a Relator..

Our health problems have worked in like manner. At the present time I am doing quite well with my lower back—I have flare ups from time to time—but able to handle okay. Pat has chronic painful lower back problems—she has worked with a Neuronist this time since mid July—she has improved but not completely—she goes back to him on the December 16th—for another procedure—this should take care of her problem—when you are on Medicare you have to follow certain procedures and that is what she has been doing. We are praying and hoping that we can resolve our health and dental problems with Doctors we know before our move.

Report wise; We finished up our Summer VBS programming the first of August . We were able to generate total Mission offerings of \$5,115.66 which was directed to the salary of Brother Makuku, who is now the minister in his home Church (which Hasten built for him and the congregation) in Odzi, Zimbabwe, Africa. Then from the Oak Grove Church in Industry, Pa, they gave Hasten a love offering of \$532.73 directed to repairs on the Dama Clinic—of course in Zimbabwe, Africa. The Clinic is up and running and meeting the health needs of many people in this area...


We drove 14,095 miles this year. Visited: Fredricktown Christian Church—New Alexander Christian Church. First time visit with the Hanoverton Christian Church—Helping them wit a renewal of their Mission Programs. John Martin, one of our own congregation is presently their Minister. Olive Hill Christian, in Olive Hill, Kentucky. Oak Grove Church of Christ, Industry, Pa. Hempfield Township Church of Christ, Greensburg, Pa.; Lake Church of Christ, Chardon, Ohio; Labelle view Church of Christ, Steubenville Ohio; Conner House Christian Church, Hubbard, Ohio; South East Christian Church, Louisville, Ky. And of course our own First Christian here in Columbiana. Conducted six Funeral Services.

May the GOOD LORD bless and keep you, may HE cause HIS face to shine upon you and give you peace.

Thank you so much for all your prayers and concerns you have shared with us across the years. Thank many of you in your gifts and monetary gifts from time to time. We love each of you dearly.

Creation KALEIDOSCOPE

Make this fun craft to remember what our heavenly Creator made. A o \triangle

What you need:

- · Adult help
- Tall chip can with lid
- · Hammer and nail
- · Acrylic paint; paintbrush
- Water, glitter, white glue o
- · Colored tissue paper
- Stronger craft glue (not hot glue)
- Star stickers or sequins
- Two 4" x 5" pieces of clear Con-Tact paper
- Scissors; pencil; permanent marker

What you do:

- In bottom center of can, hammer a hole with a nail. Paint outside of can. Let dry.
- 2. Add glitter and a little water to white glue. With a clean paintbrush, glue tissue paper to bottom outside of lid.
- Add stars to sticky side of Con-Tact paper. Place a matching piece on top, sticky sides together.
- Put craft glue along edge of can opening. Glue Con-Tact paper square over opening. Let dry.
- Place lid on can, over Con-Tact paper. Turn lid to get kaleidoscope effect.
- 6. With marker, write "In the beginning ..." on can.
